Z Energy weekly volume data

In response to requests for greater clarity around current market trading conditions Z Energy (NZX:ZEL ASX:ZEL) (Z) is providing weekly volume data during the Covid-19 pandemic.

Data includes retail volumes for the Z network including Foodstuffs, the Caltex network and for the domestic supply arrangements that Z supports. The data includes all fuel volumes for the prior week up to 11.59pm on Sunday.

Z is also disclosing commercial volume data, specifically Truckstop volumes including private Truckstops that Z supplies to our large commercial customers and Mini-Tankers. We are also providing Commercial Jet, Marine and 'Other' volumes. This is the final week of the weekly volume data releases, as per our commitment to the market for the first quarter of FY21.

Total volume for the week ended 28 June was approximately flat compared to the prior week with Retail, and 'Other domestic retail supply' slightly increasing, while being offset by decreases in Truckstops and 'Other commercial fuels'. Volumes for the week are down ~27% (~17% excluding Jet) compared to pre-lockdown levels.⁵
