

COMET VALE GOLD RECORD GOLD PRODUCTION

22 DECEMBER 2008

Highlights

- > Record high-grade gold production of 4,055 tonnes at 14.7 g/t Au
- > Increase of 50 % in reconciled grade of ore




Figure 1. Location of the Sand Queen mine at Comet Vale and tenement plan (right) showing the area of the Kingsrose Joint Venture.

The Company and Joint Venture partner Kingsrose Mining Limited (ASX:KRM) are pleased to advise the sale of highest grade gold ore produced from its Sand Queen gold mine, 100km North of Kalgoorlie (Figure 1).

Approximately **4,055 tonnes** of ore grading **14.7 g/t Au** have been sold to a third party. The grade of this ore parcel is **50 % higher** than the previous highest reconciled grade of ore treated or sold (9.74 g/t Au).

The final financial results from the sale are dependent on the average gold price for the month of December; however the Company expects a cash margin of about A\$650/oz for its share of production.




Figure 2. Longitudinal section of the Sand Queen gold mine, looking west, with the latest resource outline.

Earlier this month the Company announced a revised resource estimate which increased the global resources to 661,000 tonnes at an average grade 8.6 g/t Au; for 182,600 ounces of gold (Figure 2).

Under the Joint Venture Agreement, the Company earns 50 % of the contained gold produced from above the 3 Level, and 40 % from below the 3 Level, by incurring the transport and treatment costs. All of the ore from the latest sale is from above the 3 Level.
