MAp TRAFFIC PERFORMANCE OCTOBER 2009



MAp today released its monthly report on traffic performance at its airports for October 2009.

MAp Chief Executive Officer, Ms Kerrie Mather, said, "The October traffic results highlight the ongoing recovery across our portfolio, with all four airports reporting their strongest underlying monthly performance of 2009. For the third month in a row, Sydney traffic grew strongly in both international and domestic segments, with international traffic up 12.5%, helped in part by the school holidays and World Masters Games, and at Copenhagen O&D traffic was also ahead of last year.

"MAp welcomes the additional capacity being brought into Sydney as carriers take advantage of the improved conditions and increased demand for international travel. It's extremely pleasing to welcome the announcement of Emirates' third daily service to Dubai. Other recent positive international capacity announcements involve V Australia entering the Sydney to Fiji market from mid-December, and Thai Airways and China Eastern both de-linking

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services to offer additional non-stop services to Bangkok and Shanghai, respectively. Domestic traffic is benefiting from Tiger doubling its capacity at Sydney Airport in October.

"There have also been positive route developments at MAp's European airports. United Airlines has announced that it will operate a daily service from Brussels Airport to Chicago from spring 2010. Following Air Canada's recent announcement of a new Montreal service and Brussels Airlines' planned entry into Star Alliance in December, this is a further endorsement of the potential for Brussels Airport to act as a gateway to Star Alliance's global network of destinations.

"At Copenhagen we welcome Delta Air Lines' announcement that it will operate a daily service to New York JFK from May 2010. This will give Copenhagen passengers the opportunity to connect with Delta's extensive route network" Ms Mather added.

Sydney Airport

Key Points:

- Total passenger traffic for October is estimated to have increased 6.1% on the pcp with domestic traffic estimated to be up 3.6% on the pcp and international traffic (excluding domestic on-carriage) up 12.5% on the pcp.
- Australia was the major market which grew (+13%) together with traveller growth from the UK (+6%), New Zealand (+13%), the USA (+36%), China (+27%), Canada (+49%), Germany (+9%) and France (+18%). Korea (-23%) was the major market that declined.
- This month, Emirates announced a third daily service to Dubai and V Australia announced it would fly to Fiji from December, which will double the airlines' capacity from Sydney. Tiger doubled its capacity from Sydney during October.

Copenhagen Airport

Key Points

- October traffic was 2.7% lower than the pcp, with O&D traffic up 0.1%.
- Domestic traffic was up 13.0% on the pcp and international traffic decreased 1.1%.
- Low cost competition continues to benefit O&D traffic, both domestic and international. SAS capacity reductions negatively affected transfer traffic, although the decline has significantly improved on previous months.
- Delta Air Lines announced a daily service to New York JFK commencing May 2010. Delta will now serve both of its main US hubs, JFK and Atlanta, from Copenhagen.
- The low cost segment continues to grow. Norwegian is now selling seats for summer 2010 and has increased capacity on 16 of its routes.

Brussels Airport

Key Points

- Total traffic for October was 5.8% lower than the pcp, ahead of the year to date trend.
- Extra-EU traffic was only 1.3% lower than the pcp. Strong long haul growth from Jet Airways, the US carriers and Etihad offset fewer charter passengers travelling to non-EU destinations such as Morocco and Egypt.
- Intra-EU traffic was 8.2% lower than the pcp due to lower traffic from the European network carriers, although, positively, Brussels Airlines short haul traffic increased on last year and easyJet continues to display growth.
- United Airlines has announced that it will commence a daily flight to Chicago from Brussels in March 2010. This is the second transatlantic flight to be added to the Brussels schedule in 2010 by Star Alliance carriers, following Air Canada's Montreal service. In addition, American Airlines will be operating a new route to Boston from November 2009.

Bristol Airport

Key Points

- Overall traffic for October was 1.0% lower than the pcp.
- Domestic traffic was 1.5% higher than the pcp. This was primarily due to the Ryanair service to Belfast City, which offset a reduction in easyJet passengers.
- International traffic decreased by 1.4%, due primarily to fewer easyJet passengers and the withdrawal of Lufthansa, offset by increased Ryanair passengers from its 3rd and 4th based aircraft.
- Charter traffic was 2.1% down on the pcp.
- Ryanair commenced its new winter sun services to the Canary Islands and Malaga in October.
