## MAp TRAFFIC PERFORMANCE NOVEMBER 2009



MAp today released its monthly report on traffic performance at its airports for November 2009.

MAp Chief Executive Officer, Ms Kerrie Mather, said, "We welcome another pleasing set of traffic results this month. Led by an outstanding performance from Sydney, the portfolio continues to show the positive signs of recovery that have characterised the latter half of 2009. Sydney, Copenhagen and Brussels all had their strongest monthly traffic result in over a year.

"Sydney's traffic was up 7.8%, with both international and domestic performing strongly. We continue to see momentum in new capacity announcements with a number of new or increased services, including from Jetstar, Air New Zealand and Air Mauritius.

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"At Copenhagen Airport, total passengers grew for the first time since July 2008 and origin and destination traffic increased by 4.4%, driven by continued low cost development at the airport. NIKI is the latest carrier to announce new services, to Vienna from spring 2010, and Norwegian has also added eight new routes in the past month. The increasing low cost presence at the airport is a positive sign ahead of the opening of the low cost facility in 2010.

"At Brussels Airport, we welcome home carrier Brussels Airlines' formal entry into the Star Alliance. To mark the occasion, Brussels Airlines hosted the CEOs and senior management of the Star Alliance airlines in early December in cooperation with Brussels Airport. This followed recent announcements by various Star Alliance member airlines to expand the network of destinations in North America and to regional UK airports." Ms Mather added.

In November 2008, traffic performance at Sydney Airport was modestly impacted by the closure of Bangkok Airport for several days at the end of the month whilst Copenhagen Airport traffic was affected by the collapse of Sterling Airlines at the end of October.

#### **Sydney Airport**

#### **Key Points:**

- Total passenger traffic for November is estimated to have increased 7.8% on the pcp, the strongest month since February 2008 (which benefited from an extra day). Domestic traffic is estimated to be up 8.0% on the pcp and international traffic (excluding domestic oncarriage) up 8.4% on the pcp.
- Australia was the major market which grew (+12%) together with traveller growth from the UK (+2%), New Zealand (+11%), the USA (+22%), Korea (+2%), China (+9%), Germany (+9%) and France (+10%). Japan (-13%), India (-11%), and Canada (-2%) were the major markets that declined.
- Air New Zealand will commence twice weekly services to Rotorua this month. Air Mauritius has announced a weekly service to Mauritius via Melbourne commencing in July 2010. Jetstar's recent capacity announcement will involve a number of new services from Sydney with a tenth based aircraft for predominantly domestic routes and increased international services including 4 flights a week to Fiji from April 2010.

#### **Copenhagen Airport**

#### **Key Points**

- November traffic was 1.1% higher than the pcp, with O&D traffic up 4.4%. This was the first month of growth since July 2008.
- Domestic traffic was up 22.0% on the pcp and international traffic increased 2.3%.
- Low cost competition continues to benefit O&D traffic, both domestic and international. SAS capacity reductions impacted transfer traffic, although the decline has continued to improve on previous months.
- A new low cost airline, NIKI, has announced that it will commence operations at Copenhagen from March 2010. NIKI's inaugural service will fly daily to Vienna, continuing the expansion of low cost airlines.

#### **Brussels Airport**

#### **Key Points**

- Total traffic for October was 1.5% lower than the pcp, the strongest monthly performance since September 2008.
- Extra-EU traffic was 4.2% above the pcp. This was driven by good performance from the charter airlines to leisure destinations such as Turkey, North Africa and the Dominican Republic.
- Intra-EU traffic was 4.6% lower than the pcp. Brussels Airlines' traffic was ahead of last year, with overall traffic on the other European network carriers lower. Low cost traffic was impacted by the loss of passengers following SkyEurope's bankruptcy, partially offset by continued growth from easyJet.
- Hainan Airlines, China's largest private airline, has announced that it will increase its 3-4 times weekly service to Beijing to daily from April 2010 whilst home carrier Brussels Airlines has formally joined the Star Alliance.

#### **Bristol Airport**

#### **Key Points**

- Overall traffic for November was 4.4% lower than the pcp.
- Domestic traffic was 5.7% higher than the pcp. This was primarily due to additional passengers from Ryanair's domestic service to Belfast City.
- International traffic decreased by 6.6% due to fewer easyJet passengers and the withdrawal of Lufthansa, only partially offset by the impact of Ryanair's new 3rd and 4th based aircraft.
- Charter traffic was 14.8% down on the pcp following consolidation on certain routes between Thomas Cook and Thomsonfly and reduced services from the smaller operators.
- easyJet announced new routes to Tenerife and Cyprus commencing spring 2010. New Star Alliance member Brussels Airlines announced that it will increase its frequencies to Brussels from two to three daily.
