MAp REPORTS ON TRAFFIC PERFORMANCE AT ITS AIRPORTS FOR MAY 2009

Macquarie Airports (MAp) today released its monthly report on traffic performance at its airports for May 2009.

MAp Chief Executive Officer, Ms Kerrie Mather, said, "Traffic performance in May represented some moderation in the declines seen over the first four months of the year. Sydney international traffic is proving relatively resilient particularly taking into account the very strong performance in May last year, and Copenhagen's O&D performance has shown improvement. Copenhagen's overall performance is affected by the impact of SAS capacity reductions on transfer traffic.

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"It is pleasing to see further new route announcements across MAp's portfolio. Qantas is scheduled to receive its fourth A380 next month and will increase frequencies of this aircraft type on its Sydney-Singapore-London and Sydney-Los Angeles from early August.

"At Copenhagen, Norwegian have announced that they will further expand their suite of services from August, with routes to Vienna, Dublin, Rome and Warsaw. At Sydney, Pacific Blue's international offering will be further increased in September with trans-Tasman services to Queenstown, Wellington and Hamilton," Ms Mather added.

Sydney Airport

Key Points:

- Total passenger traffic for May is estimated to have decreased 4.4% on the pcp with domestic traffic estimated to be down 4.8% on the pcp and international traffic (excluding domestic on-carriage) down 2.9% on the pcp.
- The USA was the major market which grew (+10%) together with traveller growth from India (+3%) and France (+15%). Australia (-3%), the UK (-2%), New Zealand (-5%), Japan (-31%), Korea (-27%), Canada (-10%) and Germany (-4%) were the major markets that declined.
- Pacific Blue will commence new trans-Tasman services from Sydney in September, flying twice weekly to Queenstown and three times per week to Wellington and Hamilton.
- Qantas is due to take delivery of its fourth A380 next month and plans to increase frequencies for this aircraft type on its Sydney-Singapore-London and Sydney- Los Angeles routes from 6 August 2009. Delivery of the fifth and sixth aircraft later this year will permit further capacity increases.

Copenhagen Airport

Key Points

- May traffic was 12.7% lower than the pcp, with O&D traffic down 8.5%.
- Domestic traffic decreased 7.4% on the pcp and international traffic decreased 8.6%.
- The decline in O&D traffic has monderated compared to recent months as a result of new low cost airline capacity replacing the lost Sterling services. The decline in transfer traffic is largely associated with SAS capacity reductions
- Norwegian has announced four new routes to commence in August; to Vienna, Dublin, Rome and Warsaw.

Bristol Airport

Key Points

- Overall traffic for May was 16.9% lower than the pcp, an improvement over the first quarter performance.
- Domestic traffic was 8.6% lower than the pcp. This was primarily due to reduced flights from easyJet and Air Southwest, partially offset by the new Ryanair service to Belfast City.
- International traffic decreased 15.7%, predominantly due to capacity cuts by easyJet and the withdrawal of Lufthansa's Frankfurt service.
- Charter traffic was 26.4% down on the pcp due to the ongoing impact of the loss of XL Airways and a reduction in ad-hoc charter traffic.
