### MAp TRAFFIC PERFORMANCE MARCH 2010

MAp today released its monthly report on traffic performance at its airports for March 2010.

MAp Chief Executive Officer, Ms Kerrie Mather, said, "MAp's airports continue to show strong growth in March with a double-digit increase in traffic for our major airports versus the pcp. This performance is the result of increased capacity and the return in demand for both leisure and business travel. It is also encouraging to note the improved performance of our principal carriers.

#### **MAp Airports Limited**

"Sydney Airport delivered a 10.5% increase in traffic, driven by international passengers travelling on Jetstar, Singapore Airlines, China Southern and Emirates. All domestic carriers recorded increased passengers in March. Particularly welcome is the return in demand from Qantas passengers. Jetstar commenced a four times weekly service to Fiji and will offer an additional daily flight to Cairns from April 2010.

"Pleasingly Copenhagen Airport has continued to deliver a strong traffic performance, with total traffic up 17.2% for the month. Increased competition on the routes to Aalborg, Ronne and Karup has driven domestic traffic performance, while the effects of the strategic initiative with SAS have begun to materialise, driving an 11.4% increase in transfer traffic – the second consecutive month of growth in transfer traffic since September 2008. This will help to further strengthen Copenhagen Airport's position as the primary Scandinavian hub. Copenhagen Airport also continues to attract new services, with both Air France and Montenegro Airlines announcing new routes that will commence as part of the summer schedule.

"Brussels Airport was impacted by the British Airways strike but still grew by 1.4% for the month. The airport's long haul network is responding particularly well to the improving economic conditions, with Brussels Airlines and other major long haul carriers displaying consistently strong growth rates," Ms Mather added.

#### Impact of European air traffic situation on April traffic

As a result of the cloud of volcanic ash from Iceland, air traffic control services are not being provided to civil aircraft for safety reasons in large parts of European airspace. Brussels and Copenhagen airports have been closed to all inbound and outbound traffic since the evening of 15 April, European time. Air traffic control and safety authorities are regularly reviewing airspace conditions but at this stage it is unclear when normal operations will be resumed.

It is not yet possible to estimate the impact of the situation but safety is paramount and MAp's airports are working closely with airlines and the authorities to help assist passengers and support airlines' operational needs. Daily traffic amounts to approximately 50,000-60,000 passengers at each of Brussels and Copenhagen airports.

Mitigating actions have also been implemented at the European airports to reduce the financial impact of the closures, for example by rescheduling costly night-time construction and maintenance work for daylight hours.

#### **Sydney Airport**

Key Points:

- Total passenger traffic for March is estimated to have increased 10.5% on the pcp, with domestic traffic estimated to be up 9.7% on the pcp and international traffic (excluding domestic on-carriage) up 12.2% on the pcp.
- Australia was the major market which grew (+20%) together with traveller growth from Korea (+39%), France (+17%), China (+12%), New Zealand (+11%), Germany (+11%), Japan (+10%), the USA (+7%), Canada (+4%), and the UK (+1%). India (-5%) was the only major market that declined.
- International traffic growth was driven by Jetstar, Singapore Airlines, China Southern and Emirates. All domestic carriers recorded traffic growth during the month.
- Jetstar commenced a four times weekly services to Fiji and will offer an additional daily flight to Cairns from April 2010.

Any adjustments to preliminary statistics will be included in the year to date results in future months.

#### **Copenhagen Airport**

Key Points:

- March traffic was 17.2% higher than the pcp with O&D traffic up 19.4%. This was the fifth consecutive month of growth in passenger numbers, and the highest month of traffic growth since MAp's acquisition of Copenhagen Airports in December 2005.
- International O&D traffic was 16.6% up on the pcp, while domestic O&D traffic was 43.2% higher than the pcp. The strong performance in domestic traffic was driven by competition on the routes to Aalborg, Ronne and Karup.
- Transfer traffic was 11.4% above the pcp, the second consecutive month of growth in transfer traffic since September 2008. A key driver of the improved transfer traffic performance is the successful strategic initiative with SAS that has reduced minimum connection times on a number of selected destinations from 40 to 30 minutes.
- Air France has announced a daily service from Copenhagen to Lyon, commencing 29 March 2010. Montenegro Airlines will start a route to Montenegro's capital, Podgorica, on 1 May 2010 beginning with two weekly frequencies and increasing to three weekly frequencies from 1 July 2010.

#### **Brussels Airport**

Key Points:

- Total traffic for March was 1.4% higher than the pcp, primarily a result of good performance on long haul routes.
- Traffic was affected by strikes by British Airways' cabin crew and European air traffic controllers, which caused some frequency cancellations.
- Extra-EU traffic was 7.1% above the pcp. Brussels Airlines' long haul traffic was up 24% on the pcp due to significantly increased capacity and higher load factors. Other major long haul carriers have also performed well; high load factors and increased capacity on Jet Airways' flights, additional frequencies from Etihad and strong performances from all of the US carriers have contributed to growth.
- Intra-EU traffic was down 1.7% on the pcp. This is despite strong growth from home carrier Brussels Airlines and a substantial increase in easyJet passengers. Traffic was impacted by the British Airways cabin crew strikes, which caused frequencies to London to be cancelled in the latter half of the month. Growth continues to be impacted by Sky Europe's bankruptcy in September 2009.
