MAP TRAFFIC PERFORMANCE MAY 2010

MAp today released its monthly report on traffic performance at its airports for May 2010.

MAp Chief Executive Officer, Ms Kerrie Mather, said, "May saw traffic growth resume across the portfolio with European operations returning to normal following the impact of the volcanic ash cloud in April. Our airports continue to deliver a good performance and particularly pleasing are the capacity announcements that will deliver continued growth at our airports.

"We continue to see solid performance from Sydney Airport, supported by capacity increases, particularly on Asian routes. Sydney Airport welcomed the announcement by China Southern of increased frequencies between Sydney and Guangzhou, increasing to double daily. This outcome was secured as part of a joint effort between Sydney Airport and the NSW Government.

"Copenhagen Airport continued the strong recovery seen in traffic so far this year, with an 11.9% increase in passengers, driven by growth on SAS' Asian routes and strong domestic passenger growth. Copenhagen also welcomed a number of capacity announcements recently including the introduction of an Egypt Air direct service to Cairo and the first direct service to JFK by Delta Air Lines, reflecting Copenhagen's position as the Scandinavian hub.

"Brussels Airport continues to experience strong performance on its long haul routes following recent capacity increases as a result of Brussels Airlines' entry into the Star Alliance. The airport's long haul network is seeing continued growth with new direct services from Hainan Airlines to Shanghai and Air Canada to Montreal as well as the ongoing expansion of Brussels Airlines' African network. The low cost product is also delivering good underlying growth," Ms Mather added.

Sydney Airport

Key Points:

- Total passenger traffic for May is estimated to have increased 9.0% on the pcp, with domestic traffic estimated to be up 11.0% on the pcp and international traffic (excluding domestic on-carriage) up 4.5% on the pcp.
- Australia was the major market which grew (+7%) together with traveller growth from New Zealand (+4%), the USA (+6%), Japan (+10%), Korea (+30%), China (+18%), Canada (+11%), and Germany (+25%). The UK (-2%) and India (-15%) were the major markets that declined.
- Qantas announced capacity increases on a number of routes, with an additional six weekly services to Perth commencing in July and a daily non-stop service operated by a Boeing 747 to Johannesburg from September.
- China Southern Airlines' announcement that it will increase its service from Sydney
 Airport to a double daily from 31 October 2010 will add substantial capacity on the key
 Sydney-Guangzhou route.

Copenhagen Airport

Key Points:

- May traffic was 11.9% higher than the pcp, a return to growth following the complete closure of Danish airspace for five days in April caused by the volcanic ash cloud.
- International O&D traffic was 9.7% up on the pcp, while domestic O&D traffic was 32.4% up on the pcp. SAS continued to perform well on its long-haul operations, contributing to an 11% increase in Asian traffic with growth on its Tokyo and Beijing routes. Strong domestic growth continued with traffic to Karup more than doubling while traffic to Aarhus increased by 22%.
- Transfer traffic, 12.2% above the pcp, continued to benefit from the strategic initiative with SAS which reduces minimum connection times on selected destinations.
- Egypt Air announced the launch of a new direct service to Cairo to begin in October 2010. The route will be served 3 times weekly using a Boeing 737-800 aircraft.
- easyJet announced the first low-cost service to Paris Charles de Gaulle Airport, with 7 weekly frequencies from September 2010.
- Turkish Airlines' low cost carrier, AnadoluJet, started direct services to Ankara (4 weekly frequencies) and Istanbul (3 weekly frequencies) in early June 2010.
- Delta Air Lines launched its first non-stop service between Copenhagen Airport and New York-JFK which started in early June 2010, further strengthening Copenhagen's position as the Scandinavian hub.

Brussels Airport

Key Points:

- Total traffic for May was 1.9% higher than the pcp, primarily as a result of good performance from full service long haul carriers, as well as the LCC segment.
- In May and early June, new routes to Ankara (AnadoluJet), Istanbul (Turkish Airlines), Montreal (Air Canada), Oujda (Thomas Cook), Reykjavik (Icelandair), and Shanghai (Hainan Airlines) have been launched as well as an additional daily frequency to Paris (Brussels Airlines). A further eight routes are anticipated to open within the next three months. These include Beirut (MEA), Alghero (Alitalia), and Ercan (Corendon Airlines) as well as five new routes as part of the further development of Brussels Airlines' African network Accra, Abidjan, Cotonou, Lome and Ouagadougou.
- Extra-EU traffic was 7.2% above the pcp. The strong performance in the segment was driven by higher load factors across most major long haul carriers, new routes to Chicago (United Airlines) and Shanghai (Hainan Airlines), and increased capacity offered by US Airways and Jet Airways. The launch of the Chicago and Montreal routes by United Airlines and Air Canada further reaffirmed the role of Brussels Airport as a European Star Alliance hub and a growing gateway to Africa.
- Intra-EU traffic was 1.0% below the pcp. This is despite strong growth from home carrier Brussels Airlines and strong underlying growth in the LCC segment. The latter has been mainly driven by continuing strong growth from easyJet. Traffic was primarily impacted by the continuing effect of Sky Europe's bankruptcy in September 2009 as well as the series of British Airways cabin crew strikes, which caused frequencies to London to be cancelled during the month.
