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## BUILDER PROVIDES NOTICE OF ANTICIPATED TOLLROAD AND TOLLING SYSTEM COMPLETION

RiverCity Motorway Group has announced another important step towards completion of the Clem Jones Tunnel (CLEM7) with receipt of a "20 business days notice" from the builder Leighton Contractors and Baulderstone Bilfinger Berger Joint Venture.

There are still some steps remaining before road opening, including:

- 1. The builder must notify RiverCity Motorway Group when it considers it has achieved Tollroad Completion and Tolling System Completion.
- 2. The project's Independent Verifier will then have up to three (3) weeks to formally certify that the Tollroad and Tolling System are ready for the tunnel to open.

RiverCity will inform the market when these steps are achieved.

RiverCity Motorway Group CEO, Flan Cleary, said receipt of the "20 business days notice" was excellent news.

"The project parties remain focused on delivering the CLEM7 as early as possible, safely and professionally," Mr Cleary said.

"We look forward to successfully completing construction and soon opening the CLEM7 to traffic," he said.

The 6.8 kilometre CLEM7 will connect Bowen Hills in the north with Kangaroo Point and Woolloongabba in the south, bypassing up to 24 sets of traffic lights. It will connect with Lutwyche Road, Inner City Bypass, Shafston Avenue, the Pacific Motorway and Ipswich Road.
