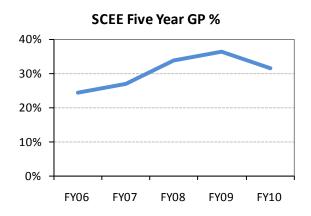


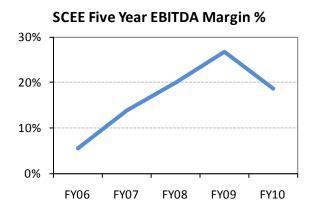
### **Historical Financial Performance**

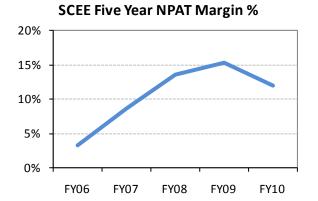




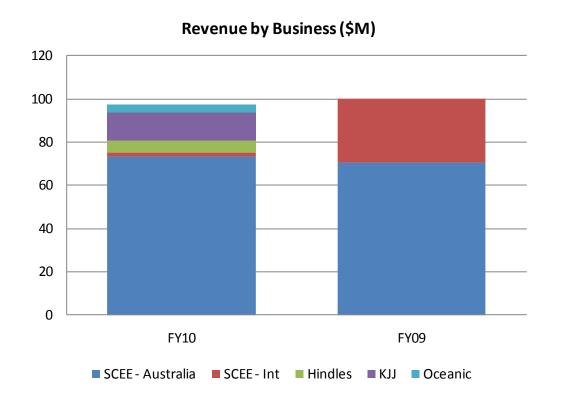










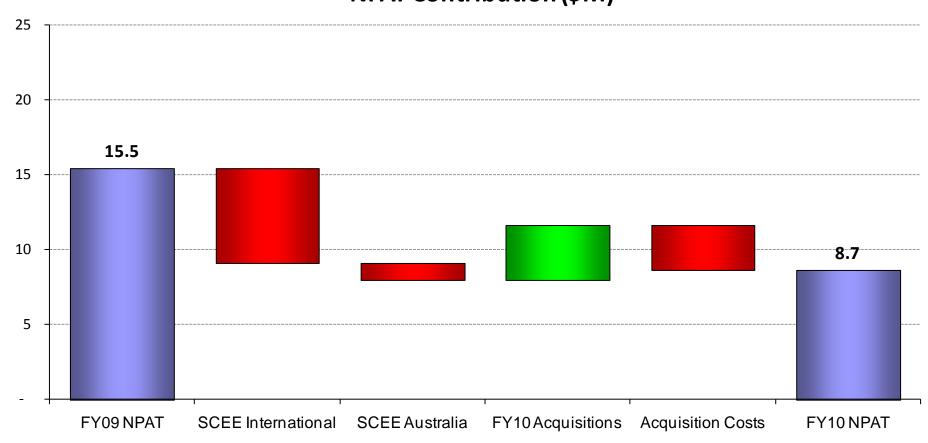


- Revenue from SCEE Australia increased by \$2.7m

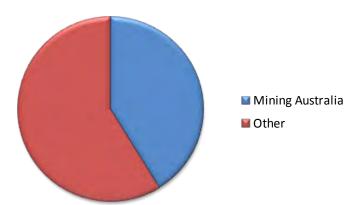






#### Minerals & Metal Australia

  - Fortescue Mining Group

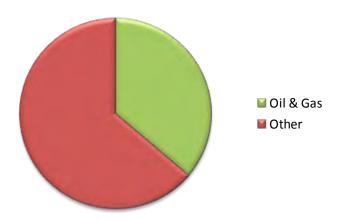






### Oil & Gas

- Key clients include Woodside, QGC, Caltex and BP

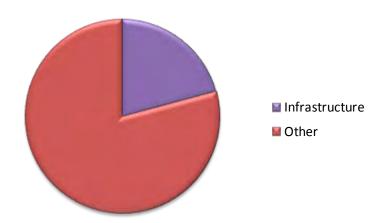






### Infrastructure

- Large greenfield minerals and oil & gas projects will see strong demand from resource sector

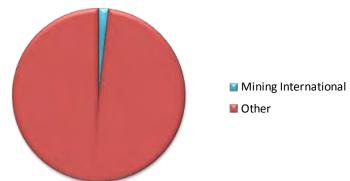






### **Minerals & Metal International**

  - Goldfields





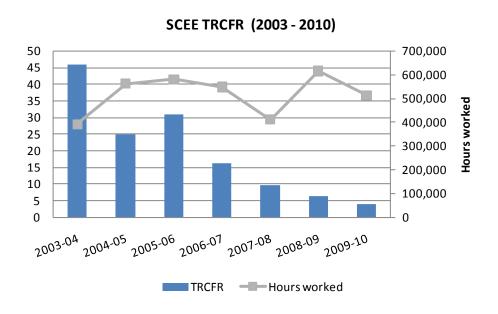

## **Summary & Outlook**

- Post GFC, key clients have re-commenced their project investment plans
- Contracted revenue currently at \$40m with tenders totalling approximately \$250m in the decision phase
- Successful re-entry into oil & gas market places SCEE in a strong position for upcoming work on Gorgon
- International projects have re-commenced with contract awards expected to be announced by Barrick over coming month
- The combination of WA mining opportunities and east coast tenders has KJJ set for solid growth
- Queensland CSG and PNG LNG opportunities for Oceanic provides strong growth pipeline for Oceanic
- Positioning of Hindles as SCEE's E & I maintenance division has begun
