Retirement of Director

This announcement is to advise of the retirement of Mr Peter Cox as a Director of the Company effective 11 December 2020. Mr Cox was appointed a Director on 28 January 2020 and has served as a member of the Company's Audit and Risk Management Committee and the Remuneration and Nomination Committee.
