

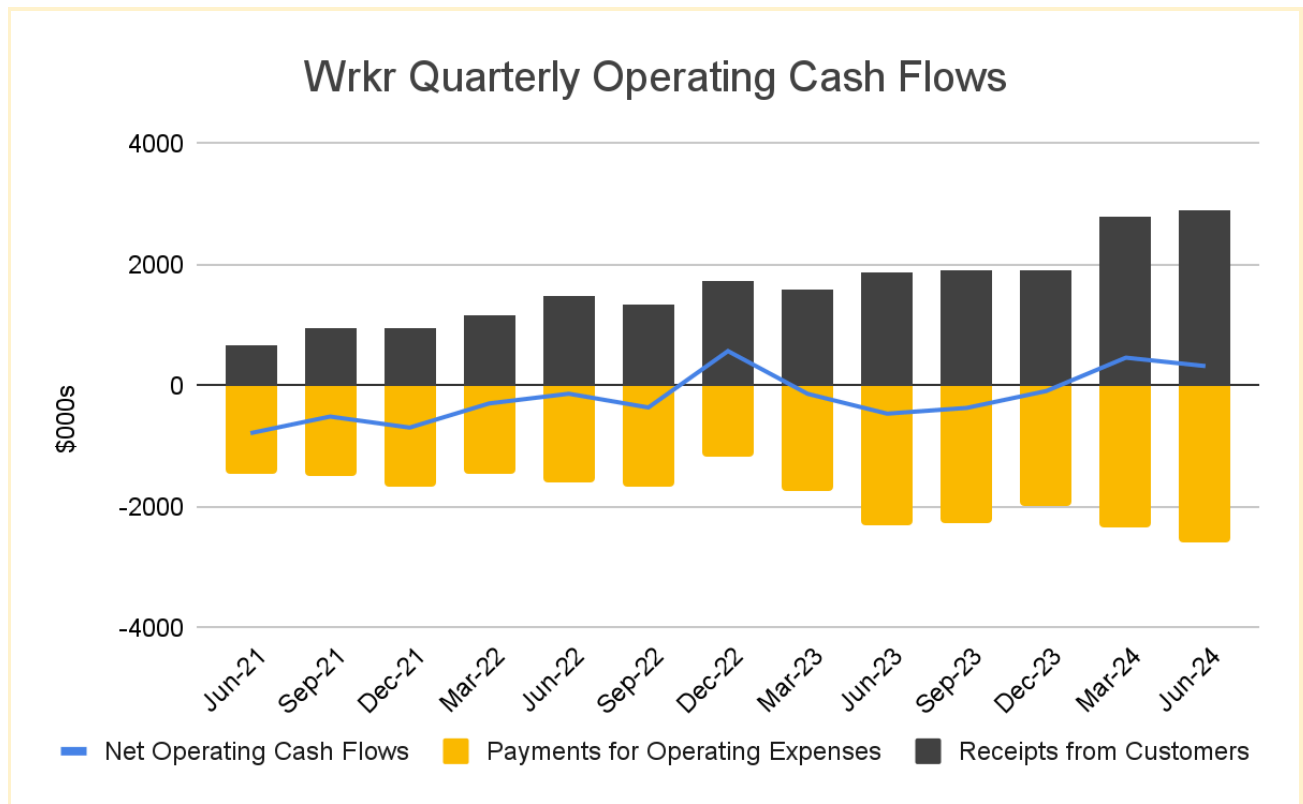


Quarterly Activity Report - Q4 FY24

Wednesday 17 July 2024

Wrkr Ltd (ASX: WRK, Wrkr or Company) is pleased to announce its Quarterly Activity Report and Appendix 4C (Quarterly Cash Flow report) for the quarter ending 30 June 2024.

Q4 FY24 FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS



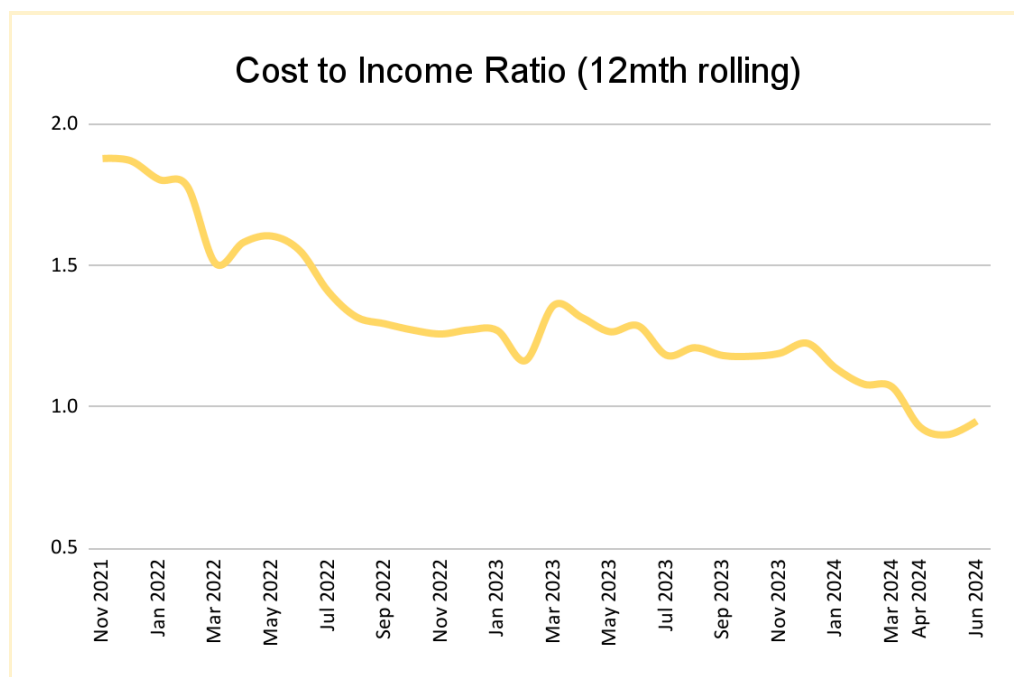
- **FY24 positive cash flows from operating activities of \$340k**

This is the first time Wrkr has achieved a positive financial year cash flow from operating activities since it was listed in 2016. This is a tremendous achievement and demonstrates the business' commitment to driving cost efficiencies, retaining key customers such as Precision Administration Services and the Commonwealth Superannuation Corporation, executing on the MUFG Retirement Solutions (formerly Link Group) contracts, generating stable revenues from the ClickSuper clearing house, and continual growth of the SMSF Hub.

- **Q4 FY24 cash receipts from customers +56% on pcg**
(\$2.90m Q4 FY24; \$1.86m Q4 FY23).



- Wrkr continues to focus on investing for growth and carefully managing costs. This is reflected in the **improvement in the cost to income ratio by 39% over the last 2 years.**

Business Strength

The completion of FY24 has seen a continued buildup of Wrkr's growing market position and brand. We expect Wrkr to benefit from the increased brand awareness and in particular, the Industry Fund platform built with MUFG Retirement Solutions (MUFG), formerly Link Group, as Funds and Employers prepare for Payday Super reforms expected in July 2026.

Q4 FY24 has been a strong quarter for Wrkr across our market activity, with customer retention and market expansion activity across all products and customer segments. Wrkr's market activity has been delivered in parallel with continued platform investment and compliance activity. Of note this quarter:

Customer retention:

Wrkr successfully signed a renewal agreement with the Australian Retirement Trust's (ART) administration entity, Precision Administration Services. This agreement extends the existing contract for licence, support and services for a further two years to run with an option in favour of



Precision to extend for a further two years. The renegotiation includes a 25% increase in pricing on licence, support & maintenance and services fees from prior terms. Additionally the contract changes provide the ability for ART to provide the platform to all of its acquired Funds.

In addition, we have seen the continuation of all of our licensed software contracts with Vialto, IOOF, and CSC, as well as the retention and renewal of users across our direct SaaS products (Wrkr PAY, READY, and SMSF Hub).

Market expansion activity:

The MUFG Hong Kong build has continued, and further extensions to the platform functionality have been identified and are underway. This activity serves to improve the Wrkr Platform's 'Pension' capability and expose broader opportunities to collaborate with MUFG in Hong Kong.

The MUFG Industry Build is nearing completion, and the Rest Pilot activity is expected to test new feature enhancements not yet seen in the market. The MUFG and Wrkr 'Industry Solution' have now been integrated into the Aaspire[™]) platform, and we are actively testing integrations to the MUFG support systems and processes. This co-investment is being positioned more broadly in the market.

The Wrkr API for Workday with KPMG has been introduced to a wider market, and numerous proposals are live. Interest has been high among Workday enterprise users.

Platform feature development:

The Wrkr Platform has seen several milestones in Q4 2024, most notably:

- Transmit Security is now live on the platform for user security and fraud prevention and is now part of the MUFG Industry Solution for both the Australia and Hong Kong platforms.
- Wrkr received our SOCII compliance certification. This is a significant milestone and testament to the platform engineering and design.

Q1 FY25 Focus and investment

Wrkr will focus on 3 key investment areas over the next two quarters:

- With less than 24 months before PayDay Super, Wrkr will invest alongside MUFG in providing commercials and implementation planning options for MUFG's broader Fund clients. With a strong interest in the Industry Solution, Wrkr expects resource planning to be critical and will look at various options to support concurrent deployments.
- The Wrkr delivery teams will focus on exceeding MUFG expectations for the Rest pilot while continuing to expand the platform's feature set for the Hong Kong Pension market.
- To meet recent interest in the Wrkr Workday API solution, Wrkr will actively expand our API products to support a broader set of international HRM Systems and their integrators.



Other

The cash expenditure incurred on the operating activities of the business in the quarter are summarised as follows:

- \$1,470k Staff costs
- \$672k Administration and corporate costs
- \$359k Operating costs
- \$76k Finance Costs
- \$4k Advertising and marketing

As required to be disclosed under ASX Listing Rules, payments to related parties in the current quarter amounted to \$76k. This amount is shown in Appendix 4C under Section 6. Payments to related parties of the entity and their associates relate to directors' fees (\$64k), and interest paid on convertible notes held by an associated entity of related parties (\$12k).

Wrkr provides compliance and payment software solutions to create efficiencies for Superfunds, payroll service providers and both large and small Australian employers.

The company has three core offerings:

- **Wrkr PLATFORM**, a modern cloud-based compliance platform for handling messaging with ATO (SuperStream, STP 2.0, PEPPOL, SBR and State authorities) and orchestrating payment processing for worker pay and super contributions for Fund Administrators
- **Wrkr PAY**, a superannuation gateway and clearinghouse and payment handling solution for secure processing of employee pay and super contributions for Payrolls and Superfunds. This product includes Wrkr SMSF Hub providing ATO messaging and contributions compliance for SMSFs
- **Wrkr READY**, a white-label employee onboarding solution to manage the compliant onboarding of full-time and casual workers
