Notice is hereby given that the Annual General Meeting of Shareholders of Boab Metals Limited ("**Company**") will be held at the offices of the Australian Institute of Company Directors, Level 1, 77 St Georges Terrace, Perth WA 6000, on **Tuesday, 26 November 2024** commencing at **11.00am (AWST)**.

The Explanatory Statement that accompanies and forms part of this Notice describes in more detail the matters to be considered.

BUSINESS

Annual Report

To consider the Annual Report of the Company and its controlled entities for the financial year ended 30 June 2024, which includes the Financial Report, the Directors' Report and the Auditor's Report.

Note: there is no requirement for Shareholders to approve the Annual Report.

Resolution 1 - Remuneration Report

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass with or without amendment, the following Resolution as an **advisory only resolution**:

"That, for the purpose of section 250R(2) of the Corporations Act and all other purposes, the Remuneration Report be adopted by Shareholders on the terms and conditions in the Explanatory Memorandum."

Note: The votes on this Resolution are advisory only and do not bind the Directors or the Company.

Voting Prohibition Statement

In accordance with sections 250BD and 250R of the Corporations Act, a vote on this Resolution must not be cast (in any capacity) by or on behalf of a member of the Key Management Personnel details of whose remuneration are included in the Remuneration Report, or a Closely Related Party of such a member.

A vote may be cast by such person if the vote is not cast on behalf of a person who is excluded from voting on this Resolution, and

- the person is appointed as a proxy by writing that specifies the way the proxy is to vote on this Resolution; or
- the voter is the Chair and the appointment of the Chair as proxy does not specify the way the proxy is to vote on this Resolution, but expressly authorises the Chair to exercise the proxy even if this Resolution is connected with the remuneration of a member of the Key Management Personnel.

Resolution 2 - Re-election of Mr Andrew Parker

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass with or without amendment, as an ordinary resolution the following:

"That, Mr Andrew Parker, who retires in accordance with Clause 13.2 of the Constitution, Listing Rule 14.4 and for all other purposes, and, being eligible and offering himself for re-election, is re-elected as a Director on the terms and conditions in the Explanatory Memorandum."

Resolution 3 - Ratification of Prior issue of Placement shares

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass with or without amendment, as an ordinary resolution the following:

"That, pursuant to and in accordance with Listing Rule 7.4 and for all other purposes, Shareholders ratify the issue of 17,169,415 Placement Shares issued under Listing Rule 7.1 on the terms and conditions in the Explanatory Memorandum."

Voting exclusion statement

The Company will disregard any votes cast in favour of this Resolution by or on behalf of any person who participated in the issue of the Placement Shares, or any of their respective associates.

However, this does not apply to a vote cast in favour of the Resolution by:

- a person as proxy or attorney for a person who is entitled to vote on this Resolution, in accordance with directions given to the proxy or attorney to vote on the resolution in that way; or
- the Chair of the meeting as proxy or attorney for a person who is entitled to vote on this Resolution, in accordance with a direction given to the Chair to vote on this Resolution as the Chair decides; or
- a holder acting solely in a nominee, trustee, custodial or other fiduciary capacity on behalf of a beneficiary provided the following conditions are met:
 - the beneficiary provides written confirmation to the holder that the beneficiary is not excluded from voting, and is not an associate of a person excluded from voting, on this Resolution; and
 - the holder votes on this Resolution in accordance with directions given by the beneficiary to the holder to vote in that way.

Resolution 4 - Approval of 10% Placement Facility

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass with or without amendment, the following Resolution as a **special resolution**:

"That, pursuant to and in accordance with Listing Rule 7.1A and for all other purposes, Shareholders approve the issue of Equity Securities totalling up to 10% of the issued capital of the Company at the time of issue, calculated in accordance with the formula prescribed in Listing Rule 7.1A.2 and on the terms and conditions in the Explanatory Memorandum."

Voting exclusion statement

The Company will disregard any votes cast in favour of this Resolution if at the time of the Meeting, the Company is proposing to make an issue of Equity Securities under Listing Rule 7.1A.2, by or on behalf of any persons who are expected to participate in, or who will obtain a material benefit as a result of, the proposed issue (except a benefit solely by reason of being a Shareholder), or any of their respective associates, or their nominees.

However, this does not apply to a vote cast in favour of the Resolution by:

- a person as proxy or attorney for a person who is entitled to vote on this Resolution, in accordance with directions given to the proxy or attorney to vote on the resolution in that way; or
- the Chair of the meeting as proxy or attorney for a person who is entitled to vote on this Resolution, in accordance with a direction given to the Chair to vote on this Resolution as the Chair decides; or
- a holder acting solely in a nominee, trustee, custodial or other fiduciary capacity on behalf of a beneficiary provided the following conditions are met:
 - the beneficiary provides written confirmation to the holder that the beneficiary is not excluded from voting, and is not an associate of a person excluded from voting, on this Resolution; and
 - the holder votes on this Resolution in accordance with directions given by the beneficiary to the holder to vote in that way.

Resolution 5 - Appointment of Auditor

"That, for the purposes of section 327B(1)(b) of the Corporations Act and for all other purposes, BDO Audit Pty Ltd, having consented in writing to act in the capacity of auditor of the Company, be appointed as auditor to the Company, with effect from the close of the Meeting, on the terms and conditions in the Explanatory Memorandum."

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

Important information

This Explanatory Statement has been prepared for the information of the shareholders of Boab Metals Limited (ACN 107 159 713) (“**Company**”) in connection with the Resolutions to be considered at the Annual General Meeting to be held at the offices of the Australian Institute of Company Directors, Level 1, 77 St Georges Terrace, Perth 6000 on **Tuesday, 26 November 2024** commencing at **11.00am (AWST)**.

The purpose of this Explanatory Statement is to provide Shareholders with all information known to the Company, which is material to a decision on how to vote on the Resolutions in the accompanying Notice of Meeting.

This Notice of Meeting and Explanatory Statement should be read in its entirety. If Shareholders are in doubt as to how to vote, they should seek advice from their professional adviser prior to voting.

Interpretation

Capitalised terms which are not otherwise defined in this Notice of Meeting and Explanatory Statement have the meanings given to those terms under the Definitions section of this Notice of Meeting.

References to “\$” and “A\$” in this Notice of Meeting and Explanatory Statement are references to Australian currency unless otherwise stated.

References to time in this Notice of Meeting and Explanatory Statement relate to the time in Perth, Western Australia.

Voting exclusion statements

Certain voting restrictions apply to the Resolutions as detailed beneath the applicable Resolutions in this Notice of Meeting.

Voting in person

To vote in person, attend the Meeting on the date and at the place set out above.

Voting by proxy

Please note that:

- a Shareholder entitled to attend and vote at the Meeting is entitled to appoint a proxy;
- a proxy need not be a Shareholder; and
- Shareholders entitled to cast two or more votes may appoint two proxies and may specify the proportion or number of votes each proxy is appointed to exercise, but where the proportion or number is not specified, each proxy may exercise half of the votes.

The enclosed Proxy Form provides further details on appointing proxies and lodging Proxy Forms.

Section 250BB(1) of the Corporations Act provides that an appointment of a proxy may specify the way the proxy is to vote on a particular resolution and, if it does:

- (a) the proxy need not vote on a show of hands, but if the proxy does so, the proxy must vote that way (i.e. as directed);
- (b) if the proxy has 2 or more appointments that specify different ways to vote on the resolution – the proxy must not vote on a show of hands;
- (c) if the proxy is the Chair of the meeting at which the resolution is voted on – the proxy must vote on a poll, and must vote that way (i.e. as directed); and
- (d) if the proxy is not the Chair – the proxy need not vote on the poll, but if the proxy does so, the proxy must vote that way (i.e. as directed).

Section 250BC of the Corporations Act provides that, if:

- (a) an appointment of a proxy specifies the way the proxy is to vote on a particular resolution at a meeting of the Company's members;
- (b) the appointed proxy is not the chair of the meeting;
- (c) at the meeting, a poll is duly demanded, or is otherwise required under section 250JA on the resolution; and
- (d) either the proxy is not recorded as attending the meeting or the proxy does not vote on the resolution,

the Chair of the meeting is taken, before voting on the resolution closes, to have been appointed as the proxy for the purposes of voting on the resolution at the meeting.

Voting entitlements

In accordance with Regulations 7.11.37 and 7.11.38 of the *Corporations Regulations 2001* (Cth), the Board has determined that a person's entitlement to vote at the Annual General Meeting will be the entitlement of that person set out in the register of Shareholders as at 5:00pm (AWST) on Friday 22 November 2024. Accordingly, transactions registered after that time will be disregarded in determining a Shareholder's entitlement to attend and vote at the Annual General Meeting.

Chair's voting intentions

If the Chair is your proxy, either by appointment or by default, and you have not indicated your voting intention, you expressly authorise the Chair to exercise the proxy in respect of Resolution 1 even though this Resolution is connected directly or indirectly with the remuneration of the Company's Key Management Personnel.

The Chair intends to exercise all available proxies in favour of all Resolutions, unless the Shareholder has expressly indicated a different voting intention.

Submitting questions

Shareholders may submit questions in advance of the Meeting to the Company. Questions must be submitted by emailing the Company Secretary at info@boabmetals.com by 5.00pm AWST **Tuesday, 19 November 2024**.

Shareholders will also have the opportunity to submit questions during the Meeting in respect to the formal items of business. In order to ask a question during the Meeting, please follow the instructions from the Chair.

The Chair will attempt to respond to the questions during the Meeting. The Chair will request prior to a Shareholder asking a question that they identify themselves (including the entity name of their shareholding and the number of Shares they hold).

REGULATORY INFORMATION

1. Annual Report

In accordance with section 317 of the Corporations Act, Shareholders will be offered the opportunity to discuss the Annual Report, including the Financial Report, the Directors' Report and the Auditor's Report for the financial year ended 30 June 2024.

There is no requirement for Shareholders to approve the Annual Report. However, the Chair will allow a reasonable opportunity for Shareholders to ask questions or make comments about the Annual Report and the management of the Company.

A representative of the Company's auditor, will be in attendance to respond to any questions raised of the auditor or on the Auditor's Report in accordance with section 250T of the Corporations Act.

The Company will not provide a hard copy of the Company's Annual Report to Shareholders unless specifically requested to do so.

2. Resolution 1 - Remuneration Report

In accordance with subsection 250R(2) of the Corporations Act, the Company must put the Remuneration Report to the vote of Shareholders. The Directors' Report contains the Remuneration Report which sets out the remuneration policy for the Company and the remuneration arrangements in place for the executive Directors, specified executives and non-executive Directors.

In accordance with subsection 250R(3) of the Corporations Act, Resolution 1 is advisory only and does not bind the Directors. If Resolution 1 is not passed,

the Directors will not be required to alter any of the arrangements in the Remuneration Report.

If the Company's Remuneration Report receives a 'no' vote of 25% or more ("**Strike**") at two consecutive Annual General Meetings, Shareholders will have the opportunity to remove the whole Board, except the managing director (if any).

Where a resolution on the Remuneration Report receives a Strike at two consecutive Annual General Meetings, the Company will be required to put to Shareholders at the second Annual General Meeting a resolution on whether another meeting should be held (within 90 days) at which all Directors (other than the managing director, if any) who were in office at the date of approval of the applicable Directors' Report must stand for re-election.

The Company's Remuneration Report did not receive a Strike at the 2023 Annual General Meeting. If the Remuneration Report receives a Strike at this Meeting, Shareholders should be aware that if a second Strike is received at the 2025 Annual General Meeting, this may result in the re-election of the Board.

The Chair will allow a reasonable opportunity for Shareholders as a whole to ask about, or make comments on the Remuneration Report.

2.1 Additional information

Resolution 1 is an ordinary resolution.

Given the personal interests of all Directors in the outcome of this Resolution, the Board declines to make a recommendation to Shareholders regarding this Resolution.

3. Resolution 2 - Re-election of Director - Mr Andrew Parker

Clause 13.1 of the Constitution provides that no Director (other than the Managing Director) shall be entitled to hold office for more than 3 years without rotation. Similarly, Listing Rule 14.4 provides that a Director (excluding the Managing Director) must not hold office without re-election past the third annual general meeting following that Director's appointment or 3 years, whichever is longer.

Non-Executive Director Mr Andrew Parker was last elected at the Company's annual general meeting held on 26 November 2021. Accordingly, Mr Parker retires by rotation at this Meeting and, being eligible and offering himself for re-election, seeks re-election pursuant to Resolution 2.

If Resolution 2 is passed, Mr Parker will retire at the conclusion of the Meeting and will be immediately re-elected as a Director.

If Resolution 2 is not passed, Mr Parker will retire at the conclusion of the Meeting and will not be re-elected as a Director at this Meeting

A brief biography of Mr Parker is set out below.

3.1 Andrew Parker Biography

Andrew holds law degree from the University of Western Australia and has significant experience in the exploration and mining industry and a wealth of expertise in corporate advisory, strategic consultancy, and capital raisings. Before joining Boab, he co-founded Trident Capital Pty Ltd, a corporate advisory and venture capital firm where he held the position of Managing Director until 2008.

If re-elected, Mr Parker is considered by the Board (with Mr Parker abstaining) to be an independent Director. Mr Parker is not considered by the Board to hold any interest, position or relationship that might influence, or reasonably be perceived to influence, in a material respect his capacity to bring an independent judgement to bear on issues before the Board and to act in the best interests of the entity as a whole rather than in the interests of an individual security holder or other party.

Mr Parker has acknowledged to the Company that he will have sufficient time to fulfil his responsibilities as a Director.

Mr Parker does not currently hold any other material directorships, other than as disclosed in this Notice.

3.2 Additional information

Resolution 2 is an ordinary resolution.

The Board (other than Mr Parker who has a personal interest in the outcome of Resolution 2) recommend that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 2 for the following reasons:

- (a) Mr Parker brings to the Board extensive leadership, governance, mining industry experience and risk management skills; and
- (b) Mr Parker's skills and experience are particularly valuable in his role as a non-executive director.

4. Resolution 3 - Ratification of Prior issues of Placement Shares

4.1 General

On 3 May 2024, the Company announced that it had received binding commitments for a placement to raise approximately \$1.7 million (before costs) (**Placement**) by the issue of 17,169,415 Shares at \$0.10 each (**Placement Shares**).

On 10 May 2024, the Company issued the Placement Shares using the Company's placement capacity under Listing Rules 7.1.

Morgans Corporate Limited and Unified Capital Partners Pty Ltd acted as joint lead managers and bookrunners to the Placement (**Joint Lead Managers**).

Resolutions 3 seeks the approval of Shareholders pursuant to Listing Rule 7.4 to ratify the issue of the Placement Shares.

4.2 Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.4

Broadly speaking, and subject to a number of exceptions, Listing Rule 7.1 limits the amount of Equity Securities that a listed company can issue without the approval of its shareholders over any 12-month period to 15% of the fully paid ordinary shares it had on issue at the start of that period.

The issue of the Placement Shares does not fit within any of the exceptions to Listing Rule 7.1 and, as it has not yet been approved by Shareholders, effectively uses up part of the Company's placement capacity under Listing Rule 7.1. This reduces the Company's capacity to issue further Equity Securities without Shareholder approval under Listing Rule 7.1 for the 12-month period following the issue of the Placement Shares.

Listing Rule 7.4 provides an exception to Listing Rule 7.1. It provides that where a company in general meeting ratifies the previous issue of securities made pursuant to Listing Rule 7.1 (and provided that the previous issue did not breach Listing Rule 7.1), those Equity Securities will be deemed to have been made with shareholder approval for the purpose of Listing Rule 7.1.

The effect of Shareholders passing Resolution 3 will be to allow the Company to retain the flexibility to issue Equity Securities in the future up to the 15% placement capacity as set out in Listing Rule 7.1 without the requirement to obtain prior Shareholder approval.

Listing Rule 7.1 was not breached at the time the Company issued the Placement Shares.

4.3 Listing Rule 14.1A

If Resolution 3 is passed, 17,169,415 Placement Shares will be excluded in calculating the Company's 15% limit in Listing Rule 7.1, effectively increasing the number of Equity Securities it can issue without Shareholder approval over the 12-month period following the issue date.

If Resolution 3 is not passed, 17,169,415 Placement Shares will continue to be included in the Company's 15% limit under Listing Rule 7.1, effectively decreasing the number of Equity Securities the Company can issue or agree to issue without obtaining prior Shareholder approval, to the extent of 17,169,415 Equity Securities for the 12-month period following the issue of the Placement Shares.

4.4 Specific information required by Listing Rule 7.5

Pursuant to and in accordance with Listing Rule 7.5, the following information is provided in relation to the ratification of the issue of the Placement Shares under Listing Rule 7.4:

(a) Persons to whom the Placement Shares were issued

The Placement Shares were issued to institutional and sophisticated investors (**Placement Participants**), none of whom is a related party of the Company or Material Investor.

The Placement Participants were identified through a bookbuild process, which involved the Company and the Joint Lead Managers seeking expressions of interest to participate in the Placement from existing contacts of the Company and clients of the assisting broker.

(b) Number and class of securities issued

A total of 17,169,415 Placement Shares were issued without Shareholder approval using the Company's Listing Rule 7.1 capacity.

The Placement Shares are fully paid ordinary shares in the capital of the Company and rank equally in all respects with the Company's existing Shares on issue.

(c) Date on which the Placement Shares were issued

The Placement Shares were issued on 10 May 2024.

(d) Price received for the issue of the Placement Shares

The Placement Shares were issued at \$0.10 per Share.

(e) Purpose of issue and use of funds

The proceeds from the issue of the Placement Shares have been and are intended to be used towards:

- advancing the Sorby Hills project toward FID;
- early site works at Sorby Hills Project;
- drilling campaign at the Sorby Hills Project and Manbarrum Project;
- to fund the costs of the Placement; and
- for general working capital purposes.

(f) Material terms of agreement

There are no other material terms to the agreement for the subscription of the Placement Shares.

(g) Voting exclusion

A voting exclusion statement is included in the Notice.

4.5 Additional information

Resolutions 3 is an ordinary resolution.

The Board recommends that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 3.

5. Resolution 4 - Approval of 10% Placement Facility

5.1 General

Resolution 4 is a special resolution which seeks Shareholder approval for the issue of Equity Securities totalling up to 10% of the issued capital of the

Company under and in accordance with Listing Rule 7.1A (“**10% Placement Facility**”).

Resolution 4 seeks Shareholder approval by way of special resolution for the Company to have the additional 10% capacity provided for in Listing Rule 7.1A to issue Equity Securities without Shareholder approval.

5.2 Listing Rule 14.1A

If Resolution 4 is passed, the Company will be able to issue equity securities up to the combined 25% limit in Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A without any further shareholder approval.

If Resolution 4 is not passed, the Company will not be able to access the additional 10% capacity to issue equity securities to issue equity securities without shareholder provided for in Listing Rule 7.1A and will remain subject to the 15% limit on issuing equity securities without shareholder approval set out in Listing Rule 7.1.

5.3 Listing Rule 7.1A

(a) Is the Company an eligible entity?

An ‘eligible entity’ means an entity which is not included in the S&P/ASX 300 Index and which has a market capitalisation of \$300,000,000 or less. The Company is an eligible entity for these purposes.

The Company is an eligible entity as it is not included in the S&P/ASX 300 Index and has a market capitalisation of approximately \$30.34m, based on the closing price of Shares (\$0.13) on 17 October 2024.

(b) What Equity Securities can be issued?

Any Equity Securities issued under the 10% Placement Facility must be in the same class as an existing quoted class of Equity Securities of the eligible entity.

As at the date of the Notice, the Company has on issue one quoted class of Equity Securities, being Shares.

(c) When can Equity Securities be issued?

Approval of the 10% Placement Facility is valid from the date of the Annual General Meeting until the earlier of:

- 12 months after the Annual General Meeting;
- the time and date of the Company’s next annual general meeting; and
- the date shareholders approve a transaction under Listing Rule 11.1.2 (significant change to the nature or scale of activities) or 11.2 (disposal of main undertaking),

(“**10% Placement Period**”).

(d) **How many Equity Securities can be issued?**

The number of Equity Securities that the Company will have the capacity to issue under the 10% Placement Facility will be calculated in accordance with the following formula:

$$(A \times D) - E$$

A = has the same meaning as in Listing Rule 7.1 when calculating an entity's 15% placement capacity – i.e. the number of shares on issue 12 months immediately preceding the date of issue or agreement (**Relevant Period**):

- plus the number of fully paid shares issued in the Relevant Period under an exception in Listing Rule 7.2 other than exceptions 9, 16 or 17;
- plus the number of fully paid Equity Securities issued in the Relevant Period on the conversion of convertible securities within Listing Rule 7.2 exception 9 where:
 - the +convertible securities were issued or agreed to be issued before the commencement of the Relevant Period; or
 - the issue of, or agreement to issue, the convertible securities was approved, or taken under the Listing Rules to have been approved, under rule 7.1 or rule 7.4,
- plus the number of fully paid Equity Securities issued in the Relevant Period under an agreement to issue securities within Listing Rule 7.2 exception 16 where:
 - the agreement was entered into before the commencement of the Relevant Period; or
 - the agreement or issue was approved, or taken under these rules to have been approved, under Listing Rule 7.1 or Listing Rule 7.4,
- plus the number of any other Equity Securities issued in the Relevant Period with approval under Listing Rule 7.1 or Listing Rule 7.4;
- plus the number of partly paid Equity Securities that became fully paid in the Relevant Period;
- less the number of fully paid Equity Securities cancelled in the Relevant Period;

D = is 10%; and

E = is the number of Equity Securities issued or agreed to be issued under Listing Rule 7.1A.2 in the Relevant Period where the issue

or agreement has not been subsequently approved by the holders of its ordinary securities under Listing Rule 7.4.

(e) What is the interaction with Listing Rule 7.1?

The Company's ability to issue Equity Securities under Listing Rule 7.1A will be in addition to its 15% annual placement capacity under Listing Rule 7.1.

(f) What is the effect of Resolution 4?

The effect of Resolution 4 will be to allow the Company to issue the Equity Securities under Listing Rule 7.1A during the 10% Placement Period without further Shareholder approval or using the Company's 15% annual placement capacity under Listing Rule 7.1

5.4 Listing Rule 7.3A

For the purposes of Listing Rule 7.3A, the following information is provided to Shareholders in relation to Resolution 4:

(a) Minimum price at which the securities may be issued

In accordance with Listing Rule 7.1A.3, any Equity Securities issued under the 10% Placement Facility will be issued for at least 75% of the VWAP of Equity Securities in the same class calculated over the 15 Trading Days on which trades in that class were recorded immediately before:

- the date on which the price of the Equity Securities to be issued is agreed; or
- if the Equity Securities are not issued within 10 Trading Days of the above date, the date on which the Equity Securities are issued.

(b) Risk of economic and voting dilution

Any issue of Equity Securities under the 10% Placement Facility will dilute Shareholders who do not participate in the issue.

If this Resolution 4 is approved by Shareholders and the Company issues Equity Securities under the 10% Placement Facility, the existing Shareholders' economic and voting power in the Company may be diluted as shown in the below table (in the case of convertible securities only if those convertible securities are converted into Shares).

6. Resolution 5 - Appointment of Auditor

6.1 General

As announced on 22 May 2024, the Company appointed BDO Audit Pty Ltd (**BDO Audit**) as the new auditor of the Company following the resignation of BDO Audit (WA) Pty Ltd (**BDO WA**) after receiving consent from ASIC on 20 June 2024 to resign as the Company's auditor in accordance with section 329(5) of the Corporations Act.

The change to the Company's auditor is a result of BDO WA restructuring its audit practice whereby the Company's audits will be conducted by BDO Audit, an authorised audit company, rather than BDO WA. In effect, there will be no change to the auditor of the Company.

Under section 327C(2) of the Corporations Act, any auditor appointed under section 327C(1) of the Corporations Act holds office until the company's next annual general meeting. The Company is therefore required to appoint an auditor of the Company to fill the vacancy in the office of auditor at this annual general meeting pursuant to section 327B of the Corporations Act.

In accordance with section 328B(1) of the Corporations Act, the Company has sought and obtained a nomination from a Shareholder for BDO Audit to be appointed as the Company's auditor. A copy of this nomination is attached to this Notice at Schedule 1.

BDO Audit has given its written consent to act as the Company's auditor.

Resolution 5 seeks Shareholder approval to appoint BDO Audit as the Company's auditor under section 327B of the Corporations Act, which requires shareholder approval for the appointment of a new auditor to fill a vacancy at the Company's annual general meeting.

If Resolution 5 is passed, the appointment of BDO Audit as the Company's new auditor will take effect at the close of this Meeting.

If Resolution 5 is not passed the Company will need to appoint a new auditor other than BDO Audit.

The Board recommends Shareholders vote in favour of this Resolution 5.
