The Infinity RIS is a hardware and software solution powered by Infinity technology, that provides the ability to encode multiple video, audio and synchronised data channels over satellite communications, and securely decodes the stream conveniently at a client locations anywhere in the world.

The Company's Collaboration Partner Fugro Australia Marine Pty Ltd (Fugro) offers the RIS under license as the 'Fugro neXt Remote Operations' for subsea inspection in offshore oil and gas. Fugro has an ongoing partnership with Australian telecommunications company Telstra to support the remote operations at the Remote Operations Centre (ROC) located at the International Telecommunications Centre in Gnangara, Western Australia. The ROC services Fugro's subsea operations off the coast of Western Australia in a whole new way and has expanded globally with opportunities in other market sectors.



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Infinity's suite of innovative products and solutions are dedicated to removing the isolation between remote locations and their control centres, and creating safer and more cost-efficient operations in remote environments. Like the RIS, the Infinity Nodestream allows for secure, low bandwidth, multiple video feeds to be distributed point-to-point from anywhere in the world via satellite and is available for a range of market sectors. Unlike the RIS which uses IP addresses to identify equipment and direct streams around the network, the Nodestream uses a central server to direct and identify equipment.

"We are privileged to have been recognised by the Australian Business Awards as a Leader in technology and innovation in 2020," said Group Managing Director, Paul Guilfoyle.
