RESPONSE TO ASX QUERIES

The Company refers to the letter dated 19 November 2009 from the Exchange and wishes to respond (*in italics*) to the queries raised as follows:

1. It is possible to conclude on the basis of the information provided that if the Company were to continue to expend cash at the rate for the quarter indicated by the Appendix 5B, the Company may not have sufficient cash to fund its activities for the next quarter. Is this the case, or are there other factors that should be taken into account in assessing the Company's position?

Yes, the Company presently may not have sufficient cash to fund its activities for the next quarter, due to the delay in production of Abadi project as a result of the need to review the terms of cooperation with neighbouring mine owner on the use of their infrastructure facilities with the objective to minimise long term logistic costs, as stated in the Activities Report for quarter ending 31 December 2009. The delay in production resulted in the delay of the projected income to be derived from the Abadi project for the present quarter.

2. Does the Company expect that in the future it will have negative operating cash flows similar to that reported in the Appendix 5B for the quarter and, if so, what steps has it taken to ensure that it has sufficient funds in order to continue its operations at that rate?

No. The Company expects that the Abadi project will commence production in the near future and as announced on 14 April 2009, all its mining operations on the Abadi project will be funded by its Joint Venture partner, Pt Toba Jaya. Further the Company will propose an interim fund raising exercise in the near future.

3. What steps has the Company taken, or what steps does it propose to take, to enable it to continue to meet its business objectives?

The Company will propose a fund raising exercise to enable it to continue to meet its business objectives.



4. Can the Company confirm that it is in compliance with the listing rules, and in particular, listing rule 3.1?

Yes, the Company confirms that it is in compliance with the listing rules, and in particular listing rule 3.1.

5. Please comment on the Company's compliance with listing rule 12.2, with reference to the matters discussed in the note to the rule.

With the imminent production from Abadi project and the proposed fund raising, the Company expects the cashflow derived will merit the continued quotation of its securities and its continued listing.

Coal Fe Resources Limited (the "Company")

I refer to the Company's Quarterly Report in the form of Appendix 5B for the period ended 31 December 2009, released to ASX Limited ("ASX") on 29 January 2010 ("Appendix 5B").

ASX notes that the Company has reported the following:

1. Net negative operating cash flows for the quarter of \$75,000;
2. Cash at end of quarter of \$11,000; and
3. Estimated cash outflows for next quarter for exploration and evaluation of \$0.

In light of the information contained in the Appendix 5B and the Interim Stop Order placed on the Prospectus, please respond to each of the following questions.

1.
