## **Native Title Agreement Reached**

Released 2 June 2010

Golden West Resources Limited (ASX Code: GWR or the Company) is pleased to announce it has reached in principle agreement with the Tarlpa native title claimants on the terms for a Mining Agreement at the Wiluna West project. The Company looks forward to an ongoing and fruitful relationship with the Tarlpa claimants and the Martu people generally.

The Mining Agreement, which GWR anticipates will be signed within the next 2 months, respects the traditional rights and customs of the Tarlpa people and encompasses a number of employment, cultural and business initiatives.

GWR Executive Director Mick Wilson said the process of negotiation with the Tarlpa people over the last eighteen months has allowed Golden West to develop a solid and long lasting working relationship built upon mutual respect and understanding. This represents a major milestone for the Company in its endeavours to bring the Wiluna West iron project into production.

“We have already kicked a number of goals in respect to indigenous employment, with 10 local indigenous employees that represent 50% of our field based personnel, some of which have been with GWR since 2006,” Mr Wilson said.

“We are proud to be part of the Wiluna Community and also a member of the Wiluna Regional Partnership Agreement (RPA),” he said.

The RPA is a co-operative approach to Indigenous development, and includes representatives from the Shire, Australian Government, WA State Government, Industry (particularly the resources industry) and of course the Aboriginal community.

Its purpose is to create, under an RPA Coordinator, a collaborative partnership to address a wide scope of social, economic and cultural development needs in the Shire of Wiluna.

The RPA will be hosting the Dalkeith Nedlands Junior Football Club (DNJFC) in Wiluna over the Foundation Day long weekend, where a number of cross cultural activities are planned culminating in a football match between the Martu Eagles and the DNJFC.
