



SIGNIFICANT GOLD RESULTS CONFIRMED AT JUNDEE SOUTH

Highlights

➤ Jundee South Project

- Second pass RAB drilling to test initial 1m at 18g/t completed
- 9 of 16 holes intersect anomalous gold mineralisation
- 5 holes with intersections >1g/t over 4m or better
- Best intersection of 48m @1.47g/t from 4m including 4m @9.62g/t
- Gold Anomaly trends to the north west for 1km
- Extension drilling planned for Q4 2012

Western Australian gold explorer, Aruma Resources Limited (ASX: AAJ) is pleased to advise that the follow up drilling programs on Twin Hills, Jundee South and Darlot East have been completed and that the first assays have been received for Jundee South and Darlot East.

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Results

Jundee South

Jundee South is located 60km east of Wiluna and some 25km south of the Jundee Mine. The results from the drilling at Jundee South are very encouraging with thick gold mineralisation and values up to 4m at 9.62g/t in hole JSR34. This hole was mineralised from 4m to 52m and the intersection was 48m at 1.47g/t.

The RAB program just completed totalled 614 m of RAB in 16 holes on the Western and Eastern Areas to follow up a previously reported 18.6g/t intersection in JSR 22 and a 1.36g/t intersection in JSR17. The mineralisation was discovered after following up soil anomalies that had not been drilled previously.

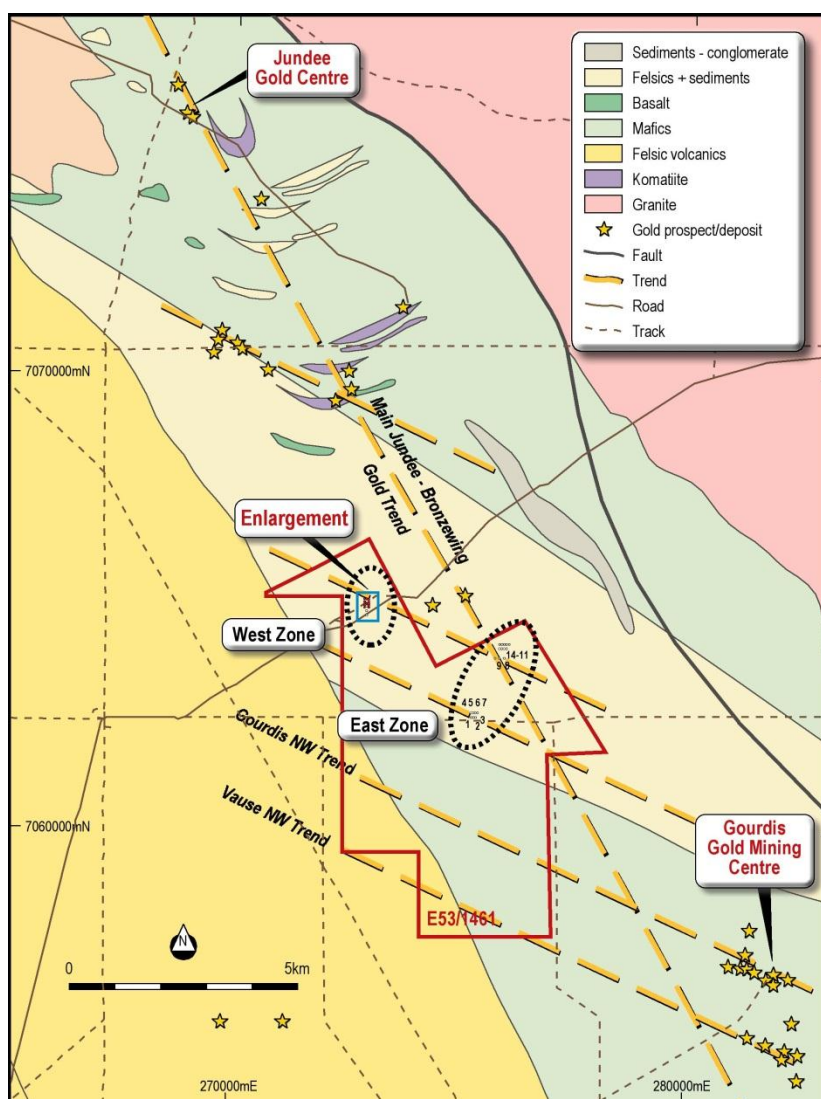


Figure 1 Drilling Location Plan on Geology with Figure 2 area (Enlargement) shown

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The significance of the recent results are the shallow depths (from 4m), thickness (>48m to end of hole), high grades (4m at 9.62g/t) in JSR 34 and it is open to the west. Hole JSR34 was mineralised from 4m to 52m (EOH) and the intersection was 48m at 1.47g/t.

The mineralisation is in weathered mafics with minor quartz veins and sediments, and consists of clays and limonite/goethite and is very soft down to >50 meters. The WNW trending lineaments are seen on the Figure 1 and reflect the structures that control the mineralisation at the nearby Gourdis and Vause Deposits. The complete tenement area will be evaluated again using geochemistry, structure and the Hyvista/Magnetics in light of this discovery.

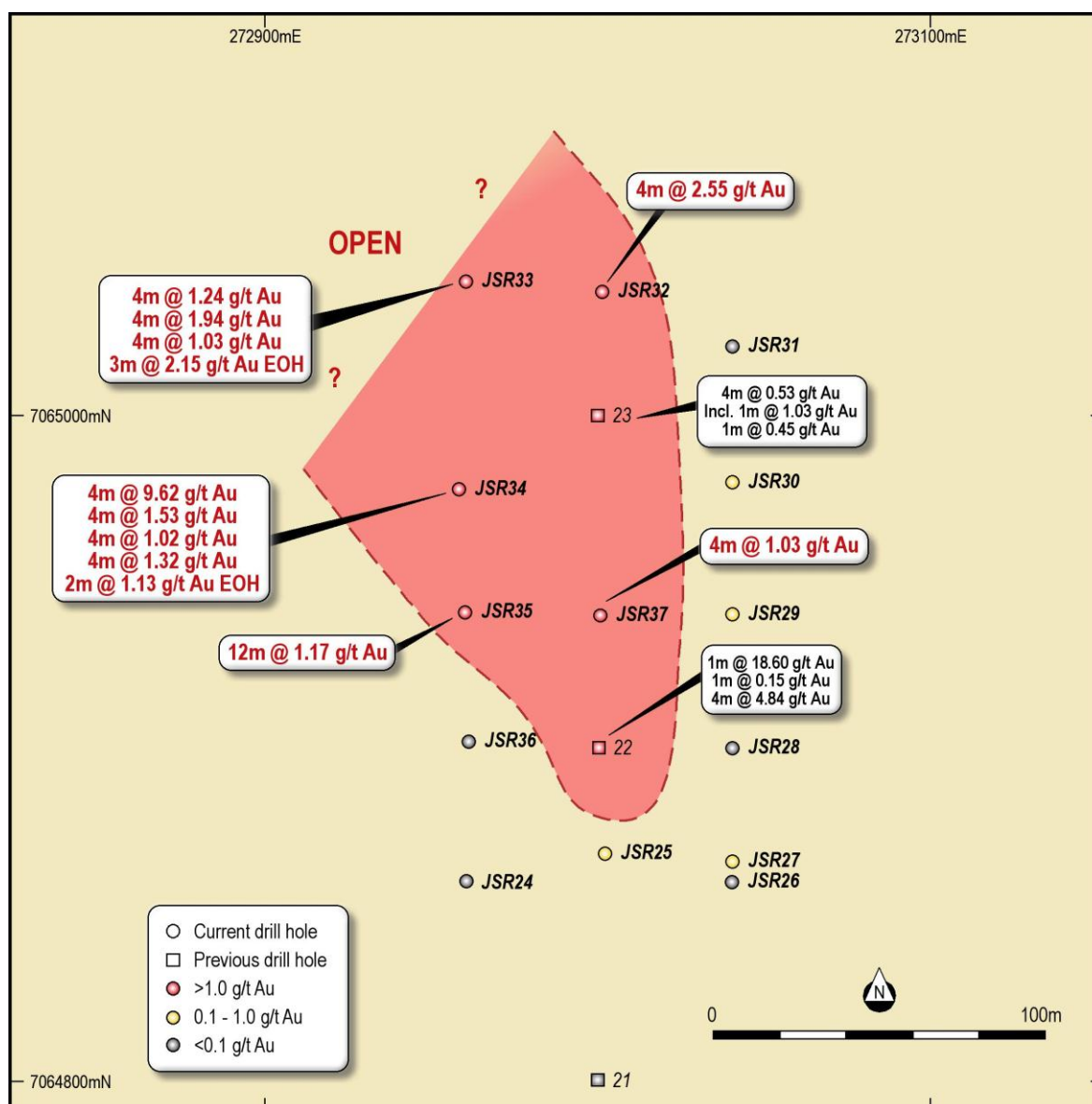


Figure 2 Plan of Drill holes in the Western Area showing the mineralised trend

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The mineralisation is trending WNW and dipping to the North and is open for over a kilometre to the West-North-West. The Program of Work (PoW) is current and will allow further drilling to be undertaken in the near future to delineate the grade, thickness and extent of this new find. Please refer to Table 2 below, for details of all the intersections greater than 0.1g/t Au.

Darlot East

The drilling at Darlot East intersected a wide paleochannel that appears to be 80m wide and up to 18m deep which is some 2km long. A mixture of basement rock types was intersected with weathering and oxidation in the Gabbro and Dolerites being logged down to 40m depths. The current program drilled 520m RAB in 23 holes to investigate a buried trend to the north of Rosewood Bore.

The assays contained no anomalous >0.1g/t values and the leases will be dropped. The deeper weathering was due to the gabbro and dolerite being more reactive, but not mineralised.

Twin Hills

The previous scout RAB drilling at Twin Hills had a best intersection of 7m at 0.19 g/t from 8m in THRB123. This drilling totalled 2164m in 141 holes with an average depth of 15m. The program will be re-evaluated on receipt of the RC results.

The recent program consisted of 773m in 7 RC holes on the northern lease on previous low grade intersections. The assays are awaited and a decision will then be made on future exploration.

Heritage Issues

Aruma has been in discussions with the Central East group and the Goldfields Land and Sea Council with regards to the Lake Yindarlgooda Mythical Site claim which is lodged but has not been registered to date. The GLSC and CEG have agreed to survey the Glandore Leases and the survey is to be done in the near future. The Company sees this as an encouraging development to enable the Fluid Flow anomalies to be tested.
