Subsequent to the end of the quarter a further \$0.75m of convertible notes has been subscribed for. As announced to the market on 26 April 2017, the Company's proposed capital raising plans have increased by up to \$10 million taking the capital raising program to up to over \$50 million in total. A total of \$32.5m worth of Convertible Notes has now been subscribed for to date with a further \$12.5m expected to be raised by the end of the September quarter. Launch of a previously announced pro rata non renounceable entitlement offer of ordinary shares to existing shareholders on a 1 for 6 entitlement basis at an issue price of 7.6c per share to raise approximately \$4.25 million (Entitlement Offer) to occur in August 2017. Entitlement Offer is to be fully underwritten by Bizzell Capital Partners, an entity associated with Armour director Stephen Bizzell.
