	<p>Answer: Net operating cash flows are expected to be lower for the time being, but still positive with income from Management Rights sufficient to cover audit ASX and other overheads. Members have approved the acquisition of the Pearl Main Beach Management Rights which are projected to add a consistent income stream. Possible future performance fee income like that received in the current quarter is of an intermittent nature depending on achieving performance hurdles under the development management agreements.</p>

	<p>Answer: The company is not currently seeking additional funding however it has the opportunity to raise funding on unencumbered residential investment property.</p>

Answer: Yes. Consistent management agreement income covers administration costs while development management agreements provide the opportunity for higher income flows to meet business objectives.
