### Request for Voluntary Suspension

EBR Systems, Inc. (ASX: “**EBR**” or the “**Company**”), requests a voluntary suspension in trading in its CHESS Depositary Interests (“**CDIs**”) quoted on the Australian Securities Exchange (“**ASX**”) be implemented with effect from prior to commencement of trading today, 14 October 2022.

In accordance with ASX Listing Rule 17.2, EBR provides the following information in relation to the request:

1. The suspension is requested pending an announcement by EBR in relation to a potential manufacturing change to its product.
2. EBR requests that the suspension remain in place until the earlier of open trade on Friday, 21 October or the release of an announcement by the Company regarding the above information.
3. EBR is also seeking a suspension as it anticipates that it will need a longer period than permitted by a trading halt to clarify the regulatory actions and make an announcement to the market.
4. EBR does not expect this to affect the results or completion date of its SOLVE study, which remains on track for H1, 2023.
5. EBR confirms that it is not aware of any reason why the suspension should not be granted or any other information necessary to inform the market about the suspension.
