MARCH 2022 QUARTERLY ACTIVITY REPORT

Highlights

- **Loretta Lee Limited (“LLL”)** acts as investment management company.
- **Footwear Trading (“Forsan”)** sales have stabilised during the quarter.
- **Footwear Manufacturing – USA (“FIT”)** sales continue to improve allowing repayment of borrowings during the quarter.
- **Home Textile Manufacturing – USA (“AMI”)** marketing development and improvement in efficiency & quality.

Merchant House International Limited (ASX: MHI) (“MHI” or “the Company”) is pleased to provide the Quarterly Activities Report for the quarter ending 31 March 2022.

Loretta Lee Limited

The company is responsible for managing the investments of the Group.

Forsan

Forsan continues to provide a stable contribution to the Group with \$3.5 million of sales generated in the March 2022 quarter.

As advised to the market on 18 February 2022 associate Tianjin Jiahua Footwear Company Limited (30% owned by MHI), ceased operations in the first quarter of 2022 due to the change of business environment in China. The factory land and building will be disposed of at current market prices. As advised on 18 February 2022 the land and buildings have an estimated total value of RMB 35 million (A\$7.7 million -before costs).

FIT

FIT has sizable and stable customers with mass shipments during the period January 2022 to March 2022 coupled with improved labour efficiency. During the quarter a new customer issued a purchase order for 40,000 pairs of boots with investment in new moulds required.

AMI

New orders with sustainable prices are under negotiation with known names, expected to be realised in the new financial year.

Corporate

As at 31 March 2022, the group has a cash balance of A\$11.30 million in the bank.
